Anticipated outcomes

- the creation of 're-usable' learning resources
- development of activity which could be replicated each year and rolled out across the Faculty
- increase in student engagement and improvement in skills levels



So far so good...

- specific student team projects have been identified
- positive reaction from teaching staff who have provided links to modules
- initial interest from students who are keen to be involved



Challenges

- delayed start to the project due to the number of other activities taking place during semester 1 in the Learning Hubs
- ongoing engagement of students in extracurricular activity
- evaluation of student team projects and how this will feed into overall evaluation of project



Looking forward

The project team is looking forward to the project being fully operational from the beginning of semester 2.

Reusable learning resources created will be displayed in the Learning Hubs. Experiences from the project and evaluation will be disseminated across the Faculty. It is hoped that similar projects will run in the future in order to for us to continue to offer our students greater opportunities for developing their skills.
