Introduction to LSRN

The Learning and Skills Research Network (LSRN) began as the Further Education Research Network in 1997 and was supported by the Learning and Skills Development Agency (LSDA). The LSRN entered a new phase in April 2006 in which it works with various partner organisations. It is based in the regions of England and Northern Ireland, with links to partners in Scotland and Wales. It brings together people involved in producing and making use of research in the lifelong learning sector and in higher education and provides a welcome to those new to research.

The LSRN's members are drawn from further education (FE) and sixth form colleges, universities, local Learning and Skills Councils, work-based training providers, local authorities, adult education centres, voluntary agencies, awarding bodies, and careers advisory services.

The conference will bring together researchers from HE and FE and give participants the opportunity to debate, share ideas and make contacts.

The conference will be of interest to academic communities throughout the LLs. The event will feature four keynote speakers and interactive sessions that allow participants to engage with aspects of research concerning:

- Higher Education in Further Education (HE in FE)
- Work-Based Learning (WBL) Assessment
- The 14 19 Reforms / Agenda
- Progression into and through HE

As well as these sessions, there will be plenty of opportunities to network with colleagues working in similar environments or tackling similar challenges.

The aim is to enable attendees to meet and debate with colleagues including:

- College and HE lecturers / researchers
- Staff from institutions from across the Lifelong Learning (LLs) sector

The four keynote speakers are:

- Judith Foreman, Director of Higher Education, Wakefield College;
- Mantz Yorke, Visiting Professor, Lancaster University;
- Liz Watson, 14-19 Advisor Yorkshire and Humber, Department for Children, Schools & Families;
- Jenny Shaw, Director, Yorkshire & Humber East Lifelong Learning Network.

The participants should expect some challenging presentations which may raise more questions than answers!

In addition, there will workshop presenters from a range of institutions who will be discussing their research (see workshop booking for further details).
