We, the Higher Education Progression Partnership South Yorkshire Plus (HeppSY+), are part of a national programme funded by the Office for Students (OfS) to support young people most at risk of missing out on higher education.

We provide impartial information, advice and guidance and engage with all higher education opportunities to help young people make the best choices for them individually.

Our objectives by 2020 are to:

- Double the number of young people accessing higher education from the target wards
- Increase progression by black and minority ethnic groups by 20%
- Address the under-representation of young men progressing to higher level studies



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
