A little about myself

I went to Adwick Comprehensive. I actually enjoyed school and in some ways it was all too short. I particularly enjoyed playing sport - especially football. We specialised in restoration work - and we were involved with some really interesting projects - such as English Heritage work at Kensington Palace and Bolsover Castle.
