## Engineering Apprentice Profile

A little about myself

I've completed my Modern Apprentice technical cert C&G228, my NVQ3 and Key Skills and I'm doing a National Certificate in Engineering year 1. I attended School in Sheffield - it was All Saints' on Granville Road. I work for Edward Prior in Sheffield it's a small engineering company in Sheffield with about 60 - 70 employees.

What qualifications did you leave school with?

What encouraged you to go for a career in engineering?
