Programme Structure

The programme offers flexibility within a clearly defined structure for progression. It has recently been validated by the OCN and uses existing BP/OCN Access to HE units as the vehicle for learning. It provides up to 8 credits of learning with the core of this in study and research skills to support learning in HE plus curriculum units which provide the underpinning theory. The choice of units available is designed to provide flexibility to support learners through a range of curriculum areas. Study skills units will be taken from

A wide choice of curriculum Units may be selected primarily from BP/OCN regional framework of units.

Who is the Programme for ?

- Learners with significant work experience, who may not have formal qualifications but who may have responsibilities within the workplace requiring skills in managing own work-load, work load of others, supervisory report writing, vocational training etc.
- Learners with significant work experience demonstrated through NVQ competencies particularly at level 3 which may require them to have a level of autonomy and/or supervisory role within a workplace, experience of applying knowledge to work activities in complex or non-routine situations.
- **1** Learners who may hold a variety of qualifications such as partially or fully completed GNVQ/ACE, AS/A level, but which do not permit entry to HE. Also noncurrent qualifications, achieved within the last five years, may be acceptable.

Suggested Modes of Delivery

The maximum timescale the **Fast Forward** programme can be delivered over is twelve weeks. The aim is to give sufficient time to develop the study/research skills of a learner over a shorter period compared to a learner on a full Access Certificate. The programme thus lends itself for delivery in a number of different modes:

- o A dedicated **full or part-time** programme delivered within a 12 week period (or a semester)
- o An 'infill' programme over twelve weeks to fit within the existing Access to HE programme e.g. learners would undertake an individualised programme of study
- o A **full-time** programme over a limited number of weeks e.g. a sixweek summer school or transition programme
- O An 'e-supported' or distance learning programme within the maximum 12 weeks
